Dear Parents and Guardians,

Thank you for your interest in additional music tuition here at LCIS. We have a strong team of external music teachers (EMTs) who can teach your chil/children at various times throughout the school day according to your needs.

There are some important guidelines that you need to agree to in order for lessons to start.

Please look at athe information on the following pages and contact the external music teacher of your choice in order to begin the process.

The External Music Teachers work closely with the Performing Arts department throughout the year to track progress and offer performance opportunities.



GUIDELINES

ENROLLMENT

Parents should contact the External Music Teachers (EMTs) and include the Director of Performing Arts, Mr Brooks (justin.brooks@lcis.ch) and Miss Monteith (cybil.monteith@lcis.ch) in this email to express interest in lessons or to book a lesson. You will then receive a confirmation from the EMT and a time for the lesson.

LESSON ROTATION

Lessons will be scheduled for the first week and from then on will take place on a rotational basis (including lunch and break time) to avoid students being taken out of the same subjects each week. The rotation will continue until the end of the term.

Students in Primary will be collected directly from their classes by the music teachers. Students in secondary will be expected to attend their lesson at the time stated by the music teacher.

ENROLMENT CONDITIONS

Enrolment is for the Term or the remainder thereof.

Written notice of discontinuation of tuition must be received four weeks prior to the end of a term addressed to the Director of Performing Arts and the relevant EMT. In the event of no notice being given fees are payable until lessons are formally cancelled.

Students will receive lessons on a weekly basis according to the length of each term.

Lessons are of thirty minutes duration and are timetabled during class time, break time or lunch time. As our teachers are not all in everyday, it may not be possible to only schedule lessons during break or lunch times. Effort is made to find the most suitable time for each student.

Notification of non-attendance needs to be received by the Music Teacher at least 24 hours prior to the lesson time for lessons to be rescheduled. Parents and students need to make direct contact with the EMT to make alternate lesson arrangements. This will be strictly adhered to.

Lessons which are missed and not rescheduled as outlined above must be paid for. In incidences of student illness notification as soon as possible should be given directly to the music teacher by the parent.

When lessons coincide with a school activity, for example sports days, camps, special class excursions or tests, it is the responsibility of the student to contact the EMT and arrange a suitable alternate time. Failure to do so will mean the lesson is forfeited and must be paid for.

In the event of the EMT not being available, missed lessons will be rescheduled or if this is not possible, they will not be charged to parents.

Tuition fees are payable for the entire term within two weeks of receiving an invoice from the teacher. Teachers will issue receipts for money paid. It is recommended payment be by bank transfer to ensure records can be maintained by the teacher and parent.

SCHEDULING FOR PRIMARY STUDENTS

Students will not be taken out of core subjects like Literacy and Maths, unless the subject teachers have confirmed this is possible in writing to the EMT.

SCHEDULING FOR SECONDARY STUDENTS

Each term lessons are timetabled on rotational basis. It must be understood that once a student is allocated a lesson time at the beginning of the week that this is a fixed commitment.

Each term lesson times will be reviewed and monitored for impact by the EMT and the PERFORMING ARTS TEAM

Lesson times are published once a week directly by email from the External Music Teacher (EMT). Each student is required to read & check their emails as part of his or her daily routine as explained in the secondary school assemblies. Students will need to check weekly times due to variations in the school routine and or additional events. These times will also be sent to parents if necessary.

No lessons are scheduled during:

- examinations week for Secondary Students
- the first week of the school year
- the last week of the school year
- during major school events performances, sports events, camps

It is the parents' and students' responsibility to inform EMTs if the student has a planned absence or is going to be away, in advance. Failure to do so will result in the lesson being charged at the regular rate of the EMT.

INSTRUMENT PRACTICE

In order to develop instrumental skills, it is expected that students practice their instrument at home (if possible), or in their own time at break and lunch in school. Practice booths may be used with permission from Mr Brooks, the Director of Performing Arts, or Miss Monteith, Music.

TUITION FEES

Tuition fees are at the discretion of the EMT. The EMT will invoice the parent for a term at the beginning of the agreement.

All payments are made directly to the EMT. No payments should come into school. It is up to the EMT and the parent to organise a suitable method of payment.

Failure to pay for classes will result in all lessons being cancelled and the Director of Performing Arts will be informed.

We thank you in advance for your understanding and commitment to the above guidelines.

American drummer, guitarist, pianist, singer and composer Kirby Bivans participated in recording a number of albums, radio and TV ads in his hometown of Chicago while pursuing a university music degree at Roosevelt University. On tour in France and Belgium in 1972 with the Free Street Theater of Chicago, Kirby gave percussion clinics and demonstrations in public schools. Moving to Nashville, Tennessee in 1983, he toured and recorded with country music stars Carl Perkins, Nicolette Larson, Freddy Hart, Vassar Clements and Lorrie Morgan. He even sang on the famous stage of the Grand Ole Opry.

In spring 1991, he came to Switzerland accompanying Nashville recording artist Karen Staley at festivals in Frütigen and Grand-Saconnex (GE). He came back three months later for a concert and in April 1992, permanently moved to Geneva and created his own group, J.KIRBY'S BAND. The band performs a mixture of country music and 60's rock & roll.

The group has recorded four CDs, composed mostly of original songs. J.KIRBY'S BAND participated in festivals in Geneva, Montreux, Diablerets, Interlaken, Craponne-sur-Arzon (the second biggest country festival in France), Mirande (the biggest country festival in Europe).

In 2021, Kirby started teaching private drum lessons at the La Cote International School.
